The complete re-design of the Muskegon Heights, Norton Shores and North Muskegon branches brought new, beautiful, userfriendly spaces to the community. And, the Muskegon Township branch moved to a new location in a highly visible area on Apple Avenue.

MADL continues to invest in the re-design and layout of its branches to create a welcoming ambiance—and to enliven and enrich learning spaces for our community.

Four more branches are also getting a new fresh look with new designs and open plan layouts, new paint and carpet and new furniture. They include the Dalton, Holton, Egelston, and Montague branches. Additionally, we are partnering with Reeths-Puffer Schools to create a Laketon Library Satellite branch in existing classroom space at the administration building on Giles Road.

We are creating more space for users and creating an inspiring experience with these new developments. Stop by and enjoy the new beautiful surroundings in our branches.

Now you can submit print jobs from any internet device from any location, even at home. You can choose to print from the website or using an App on a compatible device. Simply upload your document(s), select number of copies, choose black and white or color, and hit print. Your print job can be picked up at the branch of your choice. Visit any MADL branch location and present the name you submitted for your print job at the Circulation desk. Staff will release your documents to be printed.
