Brainfuse is our new online one-on-one tutoring service. This service connects people who want to learn with experts who want to teach. Students from kindergarten through college can access live tutors from 2:00–11:00 pm EST. There are printable practice sheets for almost all topics as well. Test prep, FAFSA assistance, and adult resources are available too. With their Writing Lab, you can submit a paper and receive feedback within 24 hours. 




