

FROMTHE DIRECTOR An Update from Kelly Richards Happy New Year to all of our Friends and Families!

We are hopeful for a better and brighter new chapter of renewed library services this year.

The year 2020 was challenging and stressful with a national pandemic and a year of significant fluctuations in our operations and services. The COVID-19 disease will be long-remembered for the tragedy of its effects on millions of people around the world and for the great work of our scientists and government working on a vaccine in record time.

From our initial closing in March, then partially re-opening, and then closing again except for limited services and limited capacity, we continued to make adjustments and kept our 24/7 access to digital resource services and wi-fi access open to the public.

The changes we had to make in our workplace were difficult. We offered curbside pickup services, online programs and expanded online resources. Curbside service is available during open branch hours, and provides convenient service to pick up holds from the safety of a vehicle or walkup service. We also offer a large variety of digital options, including online library card signup, access to a huge collection of eBooks, eAudiobooks, eVideos, eMusic and eMagazines.

We accelerated many technological services; an increase digital checkouts, an increase in wi-fi access, more hotspots for lending, wireless printing from home, fines free, and more.

Programming moved from inhouse to total virtual offerings. Our talented staff quickly adapted and began to offer many new virtual programs; Storytimes, crafts, book clubs, music and a new online LIVE early literacy show for children — Wimee's Words. We appreciate your patience and acceptance of this ever-changing environment in which we are living. We have an excellent, talented and dedicated team who care deeply about our patrons. And, it's exciting to know we will be seeing you out in your local neighborhoods with the new Bookmobile soon!

Coming in 2021 — a library on wheels — our new Bookmobile!

We will embark on an exciting new outreach service for our community. Our custom designed mobile library service will be equipped with computer stations, a collection of high demand books and materials, wi-fi, a printing and charging station, TV, PA system, lift gate and retractable awning — completely child friendly. The new service will offer convenient mobility and scheduling flexibility.

The MADL Bookmobile will travel throughout Muskegon County and provide full library services and programs to those who may not have a library branch nearby, and to those with mobility and transportation issues. We will provide new access for educational and entertainment offerings — books, movies, music, video games, wi-fi access, public computers, printing and more. 
